3. If an appraisal was obtained: Appraiser's name, address, telephone number, TIN, and a statement of the appraiser's qualifications. For donations valued at over \$5,000, an independent written appraisal is typically required.

4. Any services provided by the donor that are deductible (e.g., pro bono professional services).

Receipt and Acknowledgement Information

1. Date of receipt of written acknowledgment from the charity.
2. Key details from the charity's acknowledgment letter. For donations of \$250 or more, the charity's written acknowledgment must include:
 1. A description of the property (or services).
 2. A statement of whether the organization provided any goods or services in return for the contribution, and if so, a good-faith estimate of their value.
