1. **Base:** Place four obsidian blocks in a straight line on the ground.
2. **Sides:** On each end of the base, place three obsidian blocks vertically, forming two pillars.
3. **Top:** Connect the tops of these pillars with two obsidian blocks.

This will create a rectangular frame with a 2x3 interior space. The actual portal will form within this 2x3 opening.

Variations and Considerations

While the 10-block frame is standard, Minecraft allows for larger portal frames. Any frame of at least 4x5 blocks (outer dimensions) with an inner space of at least 2x3 blocks will function. For example, a full 4x5 rectangular frame using 14 obsidian blocks will also work. However, using more obsidian than necessary is generally not recommended unless for aesthetic purposes, as the extra blocks don't enhance functionality.

If the portal fails to activate, double-check your obsidian placement and ensure you're using a diamond or Netherite pickaxe to mine it. Also, confirm you're using flint and steel and activating it on the interior face of the obsidian frame.

1. **Scaling:** Every 1 block traveled in the Nether is equivalent to 8 blocks traveled in the Overworld. This means a portal placed at X:100, Z:100 in the Overworld will link to a portal at X:800, Z:800 in the Nether ($100 * 8$).
2. **Linking Portals:** When you create a Nether portal, the game generates a corresponding portal in the Nether based on your Overworld coordinates (divided by 8). Conversely, if you build a portal in the Nether, it will create a linked portal in the Overworld at 8 times the Nether coordinates.
3. **Precision Travel:** This scaling allows for rapid travel across vast distances in the Overworld by creating Nether portals at specific locations. For instance, building a portal in the Nether at X:100, Z:100 will link to an Overworld portal at X:800, Z:800. This is essential for establishing bases in distant Overworld locations quickly.

Building Multiple Nether Portals

You can create multiple Nether portals. The game attempts to link existing portals if they are within a certain range (approximately 1024 blocks in the Nether). If a suitable linked portal doesn't exist within

this range, a new one will be created.

Using Portals for Resource Gathering

The Nether is the primary source for several unique and valuable resources:

1. **Netherite:** Found as Ancient Debris in the Nether, this is the strongest material in the game.
2. **Quartz:** Used for redstone components and decorative blocks.
3. **Glowstone:** Provides light and is used in potions.
4. **Soul Sand and Soul Soil:** Used for soul speed enchantments and specific mob farms.
5. **Nether Wart:** Essential for potion brewing.

Troubleshooting Common Portal Issues

1. **Portal Won't Light:** Ensure you are using flint and steel and activating it on the interior face of the obsidian frame. Also, confirm that your pickaxe used to mine the obsidian was a diamond or Netherite pickaxe.
2. **Portal Activates, But No Swirling Vortex:** This usually indicates an issue with the frame size or placement. The inner space must be at least 2 blocks high and 2 blocks wide, and the frame must be a continuous loop of obsidian.
