2. Numbers to choose (k) = 6
3. Does the order of the numbers drawn matter? No, if you picked {1, 5, 10, 20, 30, 40}, it's the same winning combination as {40, 30, 20, 10, 5, 1}. This is a combination.

Calculation:

$${}_{49}C(6) = \frac{49!}{6!(49-6)!} = \frac{49!}{6!43!}$$

$${}_{49}C(6) = \frac{49 \times 48 \times 47 \times 46 \times 45 \times 44}{6 \times 5 \times 4 \times 3 \times 2 \times 1}$$

$${}_{49}C(6) = 13,983,816$$

Answer: There are 13,983,816 possible combinations of 6 numbers in this lottery.

Distinguishing Combinations from Permutations
