For weaknesses, choose something that is a genuine area for improvement but not a critical flaw for a QA role, and importantly, explain what you are doing to overcome it (e.g., "I used to struggle with estimating testing effort, but I've been actively improving my estimation skills by breaking down tasks and consulting with senior testers.").

Why do you want to work as a QA Tester for our company?

Research the company and its products. Tailor your answer to their specific needs and values. Show genuine interest and how your skills align with their goals. Mentioning their commitment to quality or a specific product feature that excites you can be impactful.
