1. **Edit Existing Texture:** Find the texture file associated with the paint color. Open it in your image editor and change its colors. You might want to use color layers or adjust hue/saturation. Save the modified texture (ensure it's saved in a compatible format, often .dds for Farming Simulator).
2. **Create a New Texture:** If you want a completely new look, you can create a fresh texture file from scratch in your image editor. Ensure it matches the dimensions of the original texture.

Important: When saving textures, pay attention to file formats and potential alpha channels (transparency). Many Farming Simulator mods

use the .dds format for textures.

Step 6: Reassign the Texture in Giants Editor

Back in the Giants Editor, with the vehicle object still selected, you should see an option to assign a new material or texture. Click the browse button or similar, and navigate to your newly edited or created texture file. Apply the changes.

Step 7: Save and Package Your Mod

Once you're happy with the color change, save your .i3d file in the Giants Editor (File > Save). Then, navigate back to your mod's folder. You'll need to create a new .zip archive containing all the modified files (the .i3d, the updated texture, and any modified XML files). Make sure the modDesc.xml file is at the root of the .zip file.

Step 8: Test in Game

Place your newly created .zip mod file into your Farming Simulator 22 mods folder (typically located in Documents\My Games\FarmingSimulator2022\mods). Launch the game, go to the shop, and find the vehicle. It should now have your custom color!
