As Australia's population grows and diversifies, its approach to childbirth will undoubtedly adapt, ensuring that every new life welcomed into the nation is met with the best possible care and support. The ongoing conversation around birth choices, safety, and the experiences of parents will shape the future of maternity services, making the seemingly constant rhythm of "one born every minute" a topic of enduring national importance.
