The double crochet stitch is significantly taller than the single and half double crochet, allowing you to create fabric more quickly. It's a very popular stitch.

1. Make a foundation chain.
2. Yarn over (yo).
3. Insert your hook into the fourth chain from the hook (or the designated stitch).
4. Yarn over (yo) again.
5. Pull up a loop (you now have three loops on your hook).
6. Yarn over (yo) again.
7. Pull through the first two loops on your hook (you now have two loops remaining).
8. Yarn over (yo) one more time.
9. Pull through the remaining two loops on your hook.
10. You have now completed one double crochet stitch.  
Repeat this process across the row.

**Turning:** To begin a new row of double crochet, you'll typically chain 3 (this turning chain often counts as the

first double crochet stitch) and turn your work. Then, work your first double crochet into the second stitch of the previous row.
