While artificial lures are popular, don't discount the effectiveness of live bait, especially for hesitant or finicky giants. Large suckers, shiners, or even small perch (where legal) are irresistible.

1. **Sucker Rigs:** A live sucker, 6-12 inches long, fished under a bobber or freelined, is a classic pike-catching tactic.
2. **Drifting with Minnows:** Large shiners or baitfish drifted along weed edges or structure can produce explosive strikes.
